

CERTIFICATE IN REUSABLE INVASIVE MEDICAL DEVICES DECONTAMINATION (MINOR AWARD) (NFQ LEVEL 6)

This Minor award is typically run over two academic semesters in one academic year.

Who is this course for?

This course was designed after extensive consultation for hospital staff working in RIMD units and also staff working in relevant medical supply companies. This program will provide the scientific background behind and practical skills required for the successful decontamination of RIMDs (reusable invasive medical devices).

Entry Requirements

This is a level 6 Minor award. Mature students over 23 are eligible. Applicants will already be employed in the RIMD decontamination units in hospitals. All applicants must have competence in written and spoken English. Generally it is expected that the applicants will be working in hospitals or related sectors.

Course Timetable

The course consists of lectures which are delivered online and practical workshops (practical workshop 2-3 days towards the end of semester) which are carried out in IT-Tallaght. Normally the course is completed over a 2 semester period.

Who can apply

This course is designed for staff working in the RIMD decontamination areas of hospitals or related sectors.

Course Summary

This Minor Award consists of a Microbiology theory module delivered online plus a separate Microbiology laboratory workshop carried out in IT-Tallaght laboratories. There is also a decontamination theory module delivered online. A separate laboratory workshop on RIMD decontamination is carried out in IT-Tallaght laboratories.
