Funding Calls Update

There are new funding calls for research projects. Grants for travel and exchanges are listed, and some information on funding calls for new (and not so new) academic researchers is provided as well. The China/Ireland SFI call is still open, the Enterprise Partnership Scheme, has been launched, and there is a new collaborative Ireland/UK funding call for Engineers and Scientists.

DETAILS OF NEW CALLS ANNOUNCED IN APRIL 2017

1. Enterprise Partnership Scheme (Postgraduate) 2017

EPSPG 2017 Call Now Open

The aim of the Irish Research Council Enterprise Partnership Scheme Postgraduate Scholarship is to link with an Enterprise Partner to award co-funded postgraduate scholarships to highly promising researchers. By working closely with an Enterprise Partner, researchers benefit from an enhanced research experience as well as having the opportunity to learn key transferable skills relevant to career formation.

3. Laureate Awards Programme:

The aims and objectives of this new Irish Research Council Scheme – The Laureate Awards programme are as follows:

- To enhance frontier basic research in Irish research-performing organisations, across all disciplines.
- To support exceptional researchers to develop their track record, appropriate to their discipline and career stage.
- To build the international competitiveness of awardees and Ireland as a whole.
- To leverage greater success for the Irish research system in European Research Council awards.
- To retain excellent researchers in the Irish system and to catalyse opportunities for talented researchers currently working outside Ireland, to relocate to Ireland.

Applications are invited from early stage (those with a PhD awarded between 3-8 years ago) and mid-career level (those with a PhD awarded between 8 and 15 years ago) researchers/academics. Funding can be obtained for up to 4 years in Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS); Life Sciences (LS) and in Physical Sciences and Engineering (PE).

4. Knowledge Exchange & Travel Grants

- **Lindau Nobel Laureate** grants for PhD students in Economics
- **New Foundations** provides small grants for activities including conference organisation and travel, and the current strand of funding will support research grants in the area of *Enhancing civic society within a national or international context*.

5. EPSRC-SFI research and technology partnership programme

The Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council, in partnership with Science Foundation Ireland, invites applications for its research and technology programme. These will support research projects that cut across national boundaries involving collaborative teams led by researchers from the UK and Ireland for joint research and technology development in the areas of chemistry, engineering, information and communications technologies, materials, mathematical sciences and physics. Grants are worth up to €500,000 each for projects with duration of one to five years. An additional contribution to overhead costs may be made.

6. SFI/EI technology innovation development award (TIDA) PROGRAMME 2017

SFI is seeking to fund researchers who are at the initial stages of developing a new or innovative technology, product, process or service with strong commercial potential. €100k in project funding is available per award for technology development

OBJECTIVES OF THE TIDA PROGRAMME

- To demonstrate the feasibility of an innovative idea for further commercial exploitation
- To build demonstrators/prototypes
- To develop awareness of entrepreneurship and the commercialisation process
- To encourage movement from academia into enterprise activities
- To improve existing industrial processes

Discipline areas include - ICT; Health and Medical; Food; Energy; Manufacturing and Materials; Services and Business Processes

7. Worldwide Cancer Research

The goal is to support research that might in future help reduce the incidence of cancer or improve cancer survival. Grants will be awarded to support fundamental or translational research into the causes, mechanisms, diagnosis, treatment or prevention of cancer. Project grants will be from 12 to 36 months in length and will be awarded to principal investigators based at any not-for-profit research institute in the world.

The principal investigator must be a suitably qualified researcher (minimum of PhD followed by three years research experience, or equivalent qualification or research experience). The maximum budget allowed is £250,000, but it should be noted that most of the three-year grants we award have a budget below £200,000.

The submission deadline for project grant applications in the April 2017 grant round is 17:00 British Summer Time on Friday 21st April 2017. Funding decisions will be communicated in October 2017 with projects starting from January 2018.

8. The Health Research Board

Applied Partnership Awards (APA) 2017 Closing Date: 15 September 2017

The HRB wish to invite applications to the 2017 HRB Applied Partnership Awards. The overarching aim of the Applied Partnership Awards is to support high quality applied research projects where academic researchers and knowledge users come together in a collaboration to focus on themes/questions which are determined by the documented needs of the Irish health and social care system.

This scheme will support high quality research proposals in clinical and/or population health practice and/or for health services management that are relevant to health priorities in Ireland. The awards will provide support for applied research proposals of between 12-24 months duration.
