Who is this course for?

The aim of this programme is to produce technically competent graduates to work in production, quality assurance or validation roles. Those that complete this course will also possess knowledge of regulatory affairs, documentation, quality systems and quality control.

Entry Requirements

Under 23 applicants must have ordinary level Grade 06 or better in five subjects. The subject list must include either English or Irish. Ordinary level Mathematics Grade 06 or better is also a requirement to apply for year one of this course.

Mature students (Over 23 years) are eligible. Eligible candidates may be interviewed. All applicants must have competence in spoken and written English.
